DRAFT PERMIT NOTICE: A draft of the renewal of the Air Operating Permit (AOP) for the Sierra Pacific Industries, Aberdeen Division Lumber Mill (SPI) located in Junction City, Washington, is available for review.

BACKGROUND: SPI is an existing facility that manufactures green and kiln-dried lumber, and has operated at the above address since 2003. The SPI Mill in Junction City requires an AOP because it has the potential to emit over 100 tons per year of volatile organic compounds and over 25 tons per year of hazardous air pollutants. AOPs are required pursuant to Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act and are designed to help ensure compliance with applicable air quality regulations and standards. This will be the first renewal of the initial AOP issued on August 13, 2010 for SPI.

DOCUMENT AVAILABILITY: Copies of the draft AOP and associated Technical Support Document (TSD) are on file and available for review at the Aberdeen Timberland Regional Library, located at 121 East Market Street, Aberdeen, WA, and are also available at ORCAA's office in Olympia and website at <http://www.orcaa.org>.

Comments may also be emailed to aaron.manley@orcaa.org. Comments will be accepted up to 11:59 p.m. on Friday, August 26, 2016. Comments should pertain to adequacy of the draft AOP and TSD in assuring compliance with applicable air quality regulations and standards. Any concerned party may request a public hearing within the specified public comment period. The request should include information to justify the need for a public hearing. If there is significant public interest, ORCAA will hold a public hearing.
