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Asbestos Waste 90-Day Storage Permit

Asbestos project regulations within Clallam, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, Mason, Pacific, and Thurston counties require that asbestos waste is transferred off site to an approved temporary storage facility within 10 days. This permit allows for 90 days of asbestos storage at any site that maintains temporary storage for asbestos waste. Such facilities include but are not limited to transfer stations approved to maintain asbestos waste and facilities belonging to asbestos abatement professionals. The temporary storage site must meet the conditions below, although conditions are not a substitute for applicable regulations.

This permit shall be renewed at the beginning of each calendar year. It is valid through December 31 of the year in which it was obtained and is up to the permit-holder to renew. If there are modifications to questions on Page 1 of this permit prior to renewal, please notify ORCAA.

The following conditions are applicable to any 90-Day Storage permit holder:

1. All asbestos-containing material (ACM) must be properly bagged, free of asbestos residue, and contain a visible label without opening. Labels must include date the material was collected for disposal, name of waste generator, and address at which the waste was generated.
2. The ACM must be stored in a controlled storage area posted with asbestos warning signs and only accessible to authorized persons.
3. The ACM storage area/container will remain locked except during transfer of asbestos containing waste material.
4. No equipment (compactors, front end loaders, etc.) will be used to load, unload, or otherwise process asbestos-containing materials.
5. Records demonstrating ACM storage has not exceeded 90 days.

The following conditions are applicable to temporary storage sites at transfer stations:

1. All conditions listed above.
2. The container will be provided with a single piece liner at least 6 mil in thickness.
3. Containers will be transferred to a landfill facility that accepts asbestos containing materials.
4. Site operators will be responsible for maintaining adequate receipt and shipment records for the ACM.

Additional conditions:

The conditions of this permit are subject to announced or unannounced inspection as stated in RCW 70A.15.2500 and ORCAA Rule 1.5 (e).
